



NLS Board Minutes — June 6th Tele-conference Minutes

Present: Tracy Schmidlin, Bob Northrup, Steve Gielda, Doug Givan, Katie Sistar, Diane Purcell, Judy Laabs-Foss. Traci opened the teleconference at 7:05 p.m.

Secretary Report – Katie has sent out 2009 Survey Reports and the NLS Constitution with an Affirmation of Affiliation form for the Lay Director/President and Spiritual Director of each secretariat to sign. She has received survey information from 46 out of 47 secretariats, and 36 signed Affirmation of Affiliation forms have been returned.

Board Reports: We discussed when reports from the Board needed to be sent to Diane for the National Meeting. They will be sent to her by June 15.

Treasurer Report – Bob has received dues from 33 secretariats. The NLS dues are due in May. The current checking balance is \$9,680.17 and the Thrivent balance is \$34,323.00.

Vice President Outreach – Steve has been in contact with Oregon, and they are ready to affiliate as Oregon Via de Cristo. They are sending three representatives to NLSAM and are making a banner to bring.

There have been 3 requests from Africa concerning Via de Cristo that he will follow up on. The Board discussed ways of working with Heart of Florida as they try to reorganize. *Bob moved that we offer a \$500 stipend for registration and travel for two people from Heart of Florida to attend the NLSAM this year. Steve seconded. Motion passed.*

Speakers are not compensated but their travel is paid for by the Board, and their registration is paid for by the Host Committee. There will be at least two speakers to discuss how the Via de Cristo Fourth Day has made a difference in their lives. The Board discussed the time frame for speakers.

Website Discussion: There was a problem with the website when it became overloaded. We have changed providers, and Larry has been working diligently to get it working up to capacity. People who have been having trouble updating their information should be able to do so now. Larry is also posting the NLSAM schedule on the web.

Minnesota Information: Diane reported that Minnesota made \$1400 on the Golf Tournament Fundraiser they held yesterday even though it was in the rain. Registrations seem to be slow in coming in. The Board agreed to each take 7 secretariats and call the Lay Directors/Presidents to encourage them to send delegates. We will also let them

know that there are three openings on the board that need to be filled. This is an opportunity to encourage secretariats and to see if there is anything they would like to share or bring up for discussion. The Board discussed having a program by Thrivent representatives while we are in Minnesota.

Board Openings: Vice President of Administration, Treasurer, Spiritual Director and Data Base Coordinator. Job descriptions are available to interested parties. The first three are elected positions and the fourth is appointed. Doug Givan is running for a second term as Spiritual Director.

Spiritual Director Report – Doug has solicited devotions and has collected 30 to go in a booklet to share with secretariats to use in their Fourth Day.

Gathering History - North Carolina is working on getting ready for 2011. We are interested in people talking and writing about their movement's history. We especially want the ones who have been involved since the early days to tell us about our history.

1972 – 2012 The 40th Anniversary of the first Lutheran weekends.

1981 – 2011 The 30th anniversary of the first National Lutheran Secretariat meeting.

1986 - 2011 The 25th anniversary of the year when the body voted to change from Cursillo to Via de Cristo.

Pr. Doug had a short devotion on hope and encouragement. *Bob moved that we adjourn. Steve seconded. Motion passed.* The meeting closed with prayer at 9:55 p.m.

NLS Board Minutes — NLS Annual Meeting Minutes

Wednesday, July 21 & 22, 2010

Present: Tracy Schmidlin, Pr. Doug Givan, Bob Northrup, Steve Gielda, Katie Sistar, Judy Laabs-Foss, Diane Purcell, Pr. Larry Conway

Tracy called the meeting to order at 1:50 p.m. Pr. Doug read Acts 2:37-47 and reminded us that we are all called to serve the Lord.

During the process of going over each day's schedule of events at this meeting, the Board discussed many items.

The delegate seating will be different this year. The delegates will find their table cards at their designated places at the tables and be seated. During the Power Point presentation, they will stand and be recognized.

The Board discussed a variety of challenges related to our movement. 1. What would be needed for a secretariat to withdraw from the National VdC? 2. We discussed Tracy's report and the importance of not getting involved with church politics but staying true to the purpose of Via de Cristo. 3. The weekend Palanca charts are up to date on the web. 4. People will be asked to list questions and comments and possible speakers on 3x5 cards and turn them in. 5. How do we know what secretariats are doing? 6. What does it mean to be Via de Cristo? 7. What does it mean to be Lutheran?

Tracy has talked with Luther Piel and Pr. Ed Simonsen, and it is agreed that we need to keep the main thing the main thing in Via de Cristo and keep it focused. The board discussed the questions to be used in small groups. Steve G. will give directions to the small group breakouts. As a follow up to the two Shining Light speakers, Rev. Frank Ruffatto and Rae Kupferschmidt, the attendees will have time to reflect on the witness. Then the small groups will meet to further reflect and discuss what it meant to them.

There will be 15 minutes of gathering music before the worship service begins each day.

There are nominees who have turned in bios for the offices available. Tracy will explain what the procedure is if someone is nominated from the floor.

There will be three seminars this year. We talked about which seminars we would be able to be a part of.

Pr. Joe Nilsen, author of Lost and Found, will not be able to be here this

year. His books are available at amazon.com. He has a second book published entitled Got a Minute, Pastor?

He has donated \$1100 to NLS from the proceeds of his first book.

The entire Essentials Manual is on line.

Bob moved that the web master be given the task to always ask Seminar and Forum presenters and Keynote Speakers to give permission to post their presentations on the web. Katie 2nd. Motion passed.

Larry explained the layout for the new website and the way to access the its different components. We had difficulties with web providers throughout 2009 and most of 2010. The weekend's lists needed updating because of this. Attendees are to let Larry know if their weekends aren't posted.

As volunteers, board members wind up with materials that need to be passed on to new board members. At times it is difficult to transfer materials and information. *Steve moved that Tracy be authorized to receive reimbursement for travel expenses and a one night hotel stay to pick up NLS materials from Nu Helgager that Nu has from when she was VP of Administration. Doug 2nd. Motion passed.*

Steve G. stated that he feels we need to do a better job of educating members about the essentials. He plans to hand out a survey that will be returned to him to get an idea of how secretariats are following the essentials.

The meeting recessed at 10:00 p.m.

The Board meeting continued at 9:00 a.m. Thursday morning.

Tracy went over the requirements for nominations for officers that she would be announcing.

The vendors are here and have a location for the meeting. The Board discussed the importance of copyrighted items relating to music vendors. We need to make sure vendors are legitimate and are obeying copyright protections.

Diane brought up international Via de Cristo's. Papua New Guinea is having weekends #54 and #55, and they are doing well. They may still be using old material and may need to be sent electronically updated material for their

weekends. Other groups are in Latvia and Sweden, Finland, Bolivia and Kenya and West Cape, Africa. It would be nice to invite them or somehow include them in our anniversary years. Steve will mention these international groups in his report at the Business Meeting to see what the body would suggest.

Diane explained some changes in the way Thrivent handles financial requests from groups. Local secretariats as well as National Hosts need to look into how to apply for funds from the National Thrivent level to help with their projects. There needs to be a liaison person in place before an organization can receive funds.

As a way of helping people get acquainted, Tracy is to hand out a People Scavenger Hunt. The first 20 to answer the questions and turn them in to Katie will receive a prize pin of praying hands on a card with a scripture verse on it.

Diane told about Babe the Blue Ox contest. There will be a drawing on Saturday night for a winner who guessed who the Blue Ox was in the video that Minnesota had available.

Diane and Katie are to place Delegate table cards on the tables in the business meeting room this morning. Delegates will go directly to their seating today.

The meeting adjourned at 10:30 a.m.

Thursday, July 22, 2010

Tracy Schmidlin opened the first Business Meeting of the 2010 NLSAM at Northwestern College in St. Paul, Minnesota at 4:00 p.m. on July 22, 2010. Pr. Doug Givan read a passage from Matthew and led in an opening prayer. Tracy welcomed everyone, gave general information about this year's meeting and made announcements.

The Board introduced themselves. The elected board members are Tracy Schmidlin – President, Steve Gielda – Vice President of Outreach, Bob Northrup – Treasurer, Katie Sistar – Secretary, Doug Givan – Spiritual Director. The appointed board members present are Judy Laabs-Foss - Newsletter Editor, Diane Purcell - Financial Adviser, Ron Millard – Historian/Archivist, Larry Conway – Web Site Coordinator, John Bradford – Distribution Center. Absent: Lucy Hightower – Data Base Coordinator, Paul Sabatier-Smith – Palanca Coor-

dinator.

Tracy asked past officers present to stand and introduce themselves. Past presidents were Larry Witham, Doug Burrows, and Randy Mullin. Past V.P. Outreach were Ron Millard and Ed Hansen. Past treasurer was Diane Purcell. Past Spiritual Directors were Pr. Nate Lungren, Pr. John Propst and the very first one, Pr. Ed Simonsen.

Steve Gielda introduced Oregon as the 48th secretariat with their delegates, Karen O'Neil and Pr. Shelley Willem.

The Host Committee chairs Tom and Deb Gryzowski made announcements and encouraged everyone to pray and sign the palanca posters. Deb announced Babe the Blue Ox contest. There is a gathering time of 15 minutes with music before worship.

Mary and Don Beutel welcomed everyone to Northwestern College and explained some of the history of the college, including that Billy Graham was the second president of the college. It moved to this location in 1970. It has had a radio ministry since 1949 and is the #1 Christian radio station in the area.

Tracy asked Jill Norell and delegates from Florida to lead the singing of the Holy Spirit prayer.

Tracy explained how important it is for the delegates to be ambassadors and to carry information back home to share.

The Seating of the Delegates was done by the secretary Katie Sistar. As each secretariat was named and shown on the power point presentation, those delegates stood and were recognized.

There were 12 secretariats that were absent out of 48.

Attendees were asked to check their registration information and put corrections on 3x5 cards and turn them in to the box at the back of the room so a corrected list could be made.

Steve Gielda presented his Outreach Report and listed the overseas groups that have been sponsored by secretariats here in the U.S. The groups are from Latvia, Sweden, Finland, Papua New Guinea, Kenya and West Cape, Africa. He asked if there was interest in asking them to participate with us in our anniversary celebrations. *Pr. Diane Wales moved that we invite VdC representatives from other countries to come to our 30th anniversary meeting next year. Terry Sanders 2nd. Motion passed.* There was

discussion regarding the financial aspect of this invitation. *Ed Broestl moved that we see what it costs and what affect it would have on our budget to pay expenses for someone to come from those distances, and bring it back to the group. Pr. Diane Wales 2nd. Motion passed.*

Pr. Doug Givan stated that the Spiritual Director Report is in the Notebook and told them, "You are here because God has called you. Make the most of your time."

Katie Sistar had delegates find the Secretary's Report in their notebooks and make a correction to the number of clergy listed on the survey data page. It should read 3118 pastors have been through a weekend. It is important to take the information back home and as secretariats elect new officers, that information should be sent to the Secretary and the Data Base Coordinator. We need to keep our files up to date so we can contact people when necessary. She read an explanation of the Affirmation of Affiliation and indicated that every secretariat needs to make sure the form has been returned to her.

Tracy asked delegates to consider hosting a NLSAM and invited them to come to the hosting meeting. We invited bids for 2013. She explained that there is a 40 page Hosting Document with guidelines on how to do it.

Tracy told the delegates that Judy Laabs-Foss is our Newsletter Editor and will lead a committee on how to do a newsletter.

Ron Millard – Archivist/Historian appealed for more history information. He asked attendees to fill out 3x5 cards and let him know when their first weekend was, who their first leaders were, the date they were incorporated and other information that would be interesting. They can send an e-mail too.

Tracy went over election procedures, including how to do nominations from the floor, and named the three positions available. Lois Witham announced that the Nominating Committee is nominating Alice Allison (TX) as VP Administration, Steve Barnett (PA) as Treasurer, and Doug Givan (IN) for a second term as Spiritual Director.

Tracy went over the times and places for the rest of the day: dinner, worship,

coffee house, first timer's photo, computer, and small groups information. When attendees go to the designated small group, stay with it for the weekend. Consider the 3 questions that are given. All were reminded to let Steve Gielda know where their small group decides to meet so everyone can find it.

Tracy called for a recess till tomorrow. Pr. Doug led the group in prayer before dinner.

Thursday, July 22, 2010

The Board met at 7:00 p.m. to discuss the financial aspect of inviting international representatives to attend next year's NLSAM and paying their way to the anniversary celebration in North Carolina.

The Finance Committee will discuss this also. A suggestion that was made is to discern if some type of video conference would be more feasible than the cost of paying for several overseas representatives' expenses.

A concern was raised. How do international Via de Cristo movements fit with NLS?

Doug moved that we recess. Steve 2nd. Motion passed

Meeting recessed at 7:45 p.m.

Friday, July 23, 2010

The second Business Meeting opened at 9:45 a.m. The group sang the Holy Spirit Prayer. Pr. Doug led in prayer.

We finished going over the Board reports that were in the Notebook.

Diane Purcell – Finance Report. She has information on the IRS requirements. Delegates need to take the report back to the secretariats and make sure they are in compliance with the May 17 IRS Directive on Non Profits. She is leading a seminar with more information.

Distribution Center - John Bradford has his report in the Notebook.

Data Base Coordinator – Lucy Hightower is not able to continue. We need to appoint a replacement. Those in attendance were instructed to look at the job description and let us know if interested.

Palanca Chair – Paul Sabatier-Smith is not here. There were challenges with the palanca charts on the website this past year. We now have a new provider and the palanca charts were up to date as of

June 8. There is a form in the Notebook that people can use to send to Paul to add weekends that aren't listed. Continue to be in sacrificial prayer for one another as palanca.

Tracy went over her President's Report and the statement that the Board wrote last October. Via de Cristo is not part of church politics nor any church body, and is not a para church. We are a movement to help build up the body of Christ. It is a method to help us share the gospel of Christ and share the good news always in love. Via de Cristo was started as intentionally Lutheran. The word and sacraments are important as basic Christianity, and we recognize Jesus Christ as the only way. We need to keep the main thing the main thing and not get side tracked from our purpose.

Ed Broestl explained the National Coordinator Campaign. We're trying to fund the position through an endowment, and we first need to set up a foundation to do that. He encouraged interested people to come to that Committee Meeting this afternoon.

Tracy explained that in 2004 we adopted a revised constitution, and affiliated secretariats signed it by 2005. Billie Lewis 2nd. Motion passed to vote on the motion. Motion was defeated.*

Martha Uhlir moved that Lay Directors can sign the Affiliation Form and send it in with a note that there is no local Spiritual Director so the NLS Board is aware

of the need. Rob Shaw-Fuller 2nd. Motion passed.

There are three positions open for election and one appointed position open. The Data Base position is appointed. Tracy opened the nominations from the floor. *Larry Witham nominated Carolyn Hawkins for the position of Vice President of Administration. Krista Neault 2nd. Motion passed.* No other nominations were made from the floor. *Billie Lewis moved that we close nominations. Dick Link 2nd. Motion passed.*

Carolyn introduced herself, and the other nominees introduced themselves again. The nominees are Vice President of Administration – Alice Allison and Carolyn Hawkins, Ballots will be provided for election to this office, Treasurer – Steve Barnett, Spiritual Director - Pr. Doug Givan.

The seminars were explained and locations given before we recessed till Saturday morning.

Pr. Doug closed this part of the meeting with prayer at 11:00 a.m.

Friday, July 23, 2010

Tracy opened the third Business Meeting at 9:45 a.m. The attendees sang the Holy Spirit Prayer and Pr. Doug offered a prayer.

Lois Witham and her Banner Committee came to the front and showed the banners that were prayed over and made, one for Oregon and two to be given at the discretion of the Board.

Tracy announced that Pr. George Kahl who had been instrumental in helping so many secretariats with their weekends and Pr. Norb Kabelitz from Sonbeam have entered their Fifth Day.

INKY is sending 5 people to help Sweden's VdC #3. Latvia sponsored them. Tracy announced that Jim Ryan from Indiana (INKY) stepped up to volunteer for the Data Base Coordinator position and has been appointed. He replaces Lucy Hightower who has served long and well in that position. Deb Gryzwinski reminded people to keep trying to identify Babe the Blue Ox.

Carolyn Karl told about Pr. Joe Nilsen's books, Lost and Found and Got a Minute, Pastor? They can be found at amazon.com. He has donated \$1100 proceeds from his first book to NLS.

Election of Officers: *Pastor Shelley moved that we accept the unopposed nominees, Steve Barnett for Treasurer and Pr. Doug Givan for Spiritual Director, by acclamation. Watson Ray 2nd. Motion passed.* Ballots were passed out for delegates to vote for Vice President of Administration. The nominees are Alice Allison and Carolyn Hawkins. Carolyn Hawkins was elected VP Administration. *Ed Broestl moved that we accept and destroy the ballots for VP Administration. Denise Bentley 2nd. Motion passed.*

Other announcements were made while the votes were counted. The installation of officers will be done at the Saturday night worship service. The offering at that service is the only offering for the weekend, and it is designated for Outreach. Nancy Killian invited the group to look over the Minnesota supply trailer that has all the supplies in it for the weekends they hold at churches. Deb told people when and where to turn in their room keys. There is to be a corrected print out of attendees by Sunday morning. Region to Region will meet one more time and will share together rather than at the business meeting this time. They were asked to do an Essentials Survey and turn it in to Steve. No committee reports were ready this morning. They will be done in the afternoon business meeting.

4. Spiritual Director's Report – 11 pastors attended. Pr. Gerry Olsen and Pr. Larry Conway are going to work on a blog for pastors. Hopefully the 30 day Devotional Book that will be made available to pilgrims for their Fourth Day that Pr. Doug is completing will be out in the Fall.

V.P. OF OUTREACH REPORT

WE ARE WHAT WE REPEATED DO

How many times have we heard; we are what we eat, we become what we believe, and we are what we repeatedly do? When filled and focused on the Holy Spirit, these are all good things. But as human nature kicks in, we often find that these common phrases have a different context, a context that brings into focus our poor behaviors or habits. This was a common unspoken theme of those I spoke to at this year's National Lutheran Secretariat meeting. It was great to speak to so many of you this year and thank you for investing some time to come to my seminar on "How to Build Your Community from the Inside".

During the seminar, there were two key questions we focused on;

What are you doing to find new pastors, keep them active and hold them accountable?

What is your outreach strategy to grow your community and build new Disciples for Christ?

Many concerns were shared about finding and keeping pastors active in the community and developing a smart outreach strategy to engage new churches and extend your reach to find new pilgrims. We were blessed to listen to an equal amount of best practices to overcome those concerns. All of the best practices that were shared throughout the three different seminars have been captured and were distributed at the final business meeting. If you did not get a copy, please email me at sgielda@cox.net and I will send you a copy.

As the title of this article states; "we become what we repeatedly do". Many secretariats have slowly slipped away from the Essentials of VdC without knowing it. They have merely become what they repeatedly do and find themselves with some of the common challenges of few active pastors, cancelling weekends because of too few pilgrims, poor attendance at Ultreyas and not enough people to serve on team. The reason that most of these concerns existed is because we have all gotten away from our essentials. We have become lax in our accountability to sponsors; we are allowing people to join team that are not in an active reunion group or small group of accountability partners. In addition, we have not used the gifts God has given us in our community to develop a smart outreach strategy that will continue to bring in new pastors and pilgrims.

I recently found in the VP of Outreach archives a document titled, "The Secretariat Wellness Checklist". After looking over the checklist, I decided to make a few modifications and give a copy to each Secretariat. At your next Ultreya or Secretariat meeting, I encourage you to invest 30-40 minutes honestly answering the questions that are provided. Do not allow one person to merely answer these questions. It defeats the purpose of the activity. Do this as a group or multiple small groups. I believe this checklist will force each community to look at their health and direction of their community. The Wellness Checklist has been posted on the National Lutheran Secretariat website under the Secre-

tariats tab, or you can simply click <http://www.viadechristo.org/resources/index.htm>

After you have completed an honest group assessment, you will naturally find the gaps or challenges your community is facing. I then encourage you to prioritize those concerns and put together a task force to address them. Of course, if you are looking for outside help, please do not hesitate to give me a call. I may not have all of the answers, but I do know that we have people in our VdC Family that have faced and overcome any challenge that your secretariat may be facing. I pray you all continue to establish plans to strengthen your communities in order to get back to the Essentials of Via de Cristo. Remember; only helicopters hover, your community is either going up and strengthening or doing down and struggling.



IRS UPDATE

As was discussed at the financial seminar at the 2010 Annual Meeting, hundreds of thousands of 501(c)(3) non-profits had their tax-exempt status revoked on May 17, 2010. This includes several Via de Cristo communities. The IRS has issued procedures to be completed and filed no later than October 15, 2010 in order to reinstate the organization's 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status. The requirements are available on the IRS website at www.irs.gov under the Charities & Non-Profits tab.

The list of revoked organizations is listed at the IRS website. If you are involved in another non-profit organization, you may want to check the list for that organization as well and alert them of the situation.

In reviewing the IRS website, it was discovered that 14 Via de Cristo Secretariats do **not** have their 501(c)(3) tax exempt status. Please review the article in the December 2008 Conexiones Newsletter for the importance of obtaining the tax exempt status.
