WORKING THE VINEYARD

Greetings to you from our Lord Jesus Christ.

WOW! What a different nine-and-half months of this year we have all experienced. The Coronavirus pandemic has changed our lives in so many ways - our professions, our homes, our educational system, our worship, our shopping, and all the ways we spend our time and energy. Even though our church communities have adapted worship, Bible studies and meetings through virtual modalities, we have not been able to conduct a virtual Via de Cristo weekend. The sharing of ideas, prayers, and concerns seem to be more personally valuable in an in-person setting and virtual meetings are best understood and more productive between people who already know each other.

In Via de Cristo, we have not been able to conduct weekend events for ten months. Many secretariats had made plans for weekends in the spring, again in the summer and again for this fall, and all have had to be cancelled. So where does this leave us as we continue to have hopes and plans for the coming year in Via de Cristo? Our work of training and calling Christians to walk with Christ in loving and serving others cannot give way to what the events and conditions of our world are at any given time. We cannot sit and wait for the world to get well to work in God's vineyard. The harvest is ripe and needs our creativity and our labor of love.

Jesus tells a story about two brothers whose father asked them each to work in the vineyard during harvest. One promises his father he'll go work in the vineyard, then doesn't. The other says that he can't help, but ends up going to help in spite of his initial decision to not work. Both continue to be sons and both continue to belong to the family. Both will likely be invited into the same work next week. But Jesus asks the hard question: "Which of the two did the will of his father?" Ultimately, only one of these two sons will make the claim that he did the will of his father.

God, in baptism, has laid claim to our lives. God has promised that wherever our life's journey takes us, we'll always have a home in the forgiving grace and renewing power of the Gospel. Yet with this claim, God has called us to a life of faithfulness, a life of working in the vineyard, a life of living as a disciple of Jesus Christ. He has called us to a life of continuing in the covenant He made with us in Holy Baptism: living among His faithful people, hearing His Word and sharing in the supper, proclaiming the good news of Christ through word and deed, serving all people, following the example of our Lord Jesus, and striving for justice and peace in all the earth. It isn't as though we have said we would work in the Via de Cristo vineyard and then refused to go. We have been held back from going to work in this vineyard. But our witness and work for the Kingdom of God is not limited to our Via de Cristo weekends. There is a vineyard in our home communities, helping those who are out of work, helping those who cannot shop for themselves, delivering meals to the sick and homebound, teaching a Bible study on Zoom, praying for the ill, the homeless, and helping others rebuild after a hurricane that leveled their homes. The people of the Lord's vineyard are just needing to go wherever the harvest is and it is all around us.

As we consider this pledge - a pledge made whenever we welcome new brothers and sisters into our family of faith, whenever we plan a weekend of Via de Cristo for new pilgrims, and when we get disappointed and cannot conduct the weekend we planned, we remember our Lord's question: "Which of the two did the will of his father?"

Our God, who is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast

BUILDING THE BRIDGES THAT CONNECT US



Hello, all 4th Day-ers out there!! God's peace and love be with you all. In this installment of the "Corner", I want to give you an update on Bridge Building. In my Annual Report, that was one focal point I want to highlight and focus our ministry on. I am glad we are not talking about physical bridges, because I am "all thumbs" and you probably wouldn't want to cross any bridge I built. But, as with any bridge, physical or metaphorical, you start with building blocks and apply the effort to make it take shape and ultimately connect

two sides that are distant. That is what I want to focus on as a 4th Day Community. There are three building blocks that the Executive Committee is discussing and plan to launch that we pray will help us all.

- 1. **Communications Committee:** Communications are what connects us as humans and as we have learned in our weekends "an isolated Christian is a paralyzed Christian." We feel, as a leadership body, that our communications can improve in several facets. We are in the process of defining the scope and goals of a Communications Committee to explore and define the tactics on how the Via de Cristo Ministry can become more effective communicators. We will reach out to the entire community to fill this committee in the near future. Watch for more information.
- 2. Technology Committee: As the Covid-19 pandemic has taught us, we are more reliant on technology than ever before. If you aren't sold, find a busy street corner or mall and just watch people walk by. Three out of four have their heads in a phone, or earbuds, talking to someone. We are widespread throughout the US and places outside the US, so technology is a critical element of traversing the physical distance between us. We are also in the planning stage for creating a Technology Committee to help us determine new and creative ways of bringing us closer together as the body of Christ in our 4th Day. Watch for more information later this fall or early winter as to how you can serve on this team.
- 3. Grant Writing Team: As any of you have served on a Secretariat Leadership Team or at the National level know, the monetary part of the Via de Cristo Ministry can be difficult, especially during these times when we are not hosting weekends. God always provides, but we also need to do our part as well. Remember the phrase, "Pray like God will do Everything; Work like God will do nothing". I have been asked to create a grant writing team with the goal of expanding our revenue streams beyond the weekends and Annual Dues to better support the activities of our secretariats. This is not just a National endeavor, but one that every secretariat can embrace. I would love to have people who have some experience help me get this off the ground. Please spread the word among your fellow 4th Day-ers and reach out to me if anyone is interested.

I want to leave you with a thought from the devotional my reunion group is doing. It is "Jesus Calling" by Sarah Young. I love it as it is written in the first person - like Jesus is talking directly to you. One of the days last week was on time management, which is something I have struggled with as of late. The takeaway was, "Learn to Master Time or it will Master You!!" If I can do a better job at this, there will be more time for me to devote to His ministry. I challenge you to work together with me and hold me accountable. That additional time can really help our ministry.

I pray the road rises to meet your feet, the wind be at your back, the sun shines warm on your face and God holds you close in the palm of his hand until we talk again!! God Loves You and So Do I.

REGION 5 REPORT

In these strange times, it has been difficult to keep our communities on track, but who's timing is it really? Even though most secretariats had to cancel weekends, ultreyas and meetings, the thing to remember is God's way is always perfect, even when we cannot see it. He is in control even when things seem out of control. In Colossians 1:17, Paul reminds us that, "He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together."

Looking deeper into what's happening in 2020, we see how God is orchestrating the events in each of our lives. Many of us have suffered hardships and maybe even felt our prayers and cries to God were not heard. Just because we didn't see an immediate change in our situations, doesn't mean God didn't hear us. What we interpret as a slow response is actually God working things out in His timing. In Proverbs 16:9, Solomon explains, "The heart of man plans his way, but the Lord establishes his steps." This seemed like such an important point that it is again repeated many times throughout Proverbs including Proverbs 19:21, "Many are the plans in the mind of a man, but it is the purpose of the Lord that will stand."

The best example I can give of how perfect God's timing really is would be through my own experience. I am a private caregiver for the elderly, but by the end of March, I found myself jobless with no income. I prayed that God would meet my needs and help me get back to work. Well, He did meet my needs, but instead, my mother became my client. She became seriously ill with a host of issues including a dangerous pelvic prolapse. If I was still working with my clients, I could not have taken care of her the way she needed, including taking her to the hospital in DC for appointments and eventually surgery. When I look back at all that has transpired this year, I see God's hand orchestrating the events in my life so that I could be where He needed me to be. I am happy to say she has made a remarkable return to health after surgery and I have been able to return to work.

This pause in our lives has given us a second chance to reevaluate our faith and trust in God and His timing – to actually see God's work in action. After all, our lives can change in a blink of an eye. This gives us an even more powerful reason to live for all the moments He gives with joy and purpose. God has a plan for each one of us. Trusting God's plan for our lives and not our own plans will give us much needed peace in the process. His plans always exceed our wildest expectations because it matches us up with what we are meant to be doing and not what we think we should be doing. This should give us hope as Jeremiah relays this in Jeremiah 29:11-12, "'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you.'" The only way we can trust in God's timing fully is to spend time with God and allow His Word to seep into our hearts in all the corners that hide fear, sadness, discouragement, worry and anxiety.

Your path this year may be dark and may be blocked by obstacles in your way. A sorrow may have overshadowed your life. The plan for your life may have completely changed. You may not know which way to turn, but our God is faithful and He will embrace you!! You may not understand it, but He does and that is enough. As we close in on the end of 2020, whether it has been sunshine or clouds, plenty or want, sorrow or joy, sickness or health, one thing I have learned is His way IS perfect! God loves you, and so do I.


