## Keynote Address: "Behind the Curtain"

The audience was absolutely blessed to hear this powerful keynote address presented by the Reverend Dr. Carl Billings from Discovery Church in Brooklyn Center, Minnesota.

Pastor Billings embraced the theme of our weekend by showing us a clip of his favorite movie, "The Wizard of Oz." The highlighted segment ended with Toto (Dorothy's dog) pulling away a curtain to show Dorothy and her friends that the 'Great and Powerful Wizard of Oz' was hiding his true identify.

This could be a God critique of our culture today and how so many of us are hiding behind a curtain or a mask because out of fear of what people might think of us. We put the curtain up, or the mask on, so people will not see the real us.

Pr. Billings cautioned the audience that the real problem when we hide from God is that we are actually being a hypocrite. One of the original definitions of hypocrite is a mask worn by an actor when portraying a character role. We wear a mask to pretend to be something we are not. Pr. Billings encouraged us to drop the masks, take off the vail and pull back the curtain we are hiding behind. After all...it's "not just about you, it's about God's love for you!


He challenged us to take a pause when we say the famous VdC line, "God loves you and so do I." He asked us to say God loves you... then STOP! Pause and think about that. God who created everything... is the same all powerful God who deeply loves you! This God will see behind whatever mask, curtain or vail we try to hide behind. God sees everything! And... He still deeply and passionately loves you!!

The message of the cross and that He died for us is about Jesus's love transforming us! Transforming us to be more Christ like at all times. Pr. Billings said that just because we go to church, confess our sins, make sure our children and grandchildren are baptized that we won't go to hell. Going to church is not like taking out a fire insurance policy. You know the type that gets filed away and forgotten about until we need it. We need to continually and faithfully worship our God all day in every day of our lives.

God's desire to transform us was further evidenced when Pr. Billings brilliantly weaved his message int the weekend's verse 2 Corinthian's 3:18 by highlighting that we are continually being transformed into the image of Christ with every increasing glory shared. A caterpillar turns into a butterfly but it will always be part caterpillar.

He Illuminated to us in many ways how our God's love for us is transforming and that we are to take that love home with us and touch all those around us with that powerful love. That it's about the Holy Spirit using us to love others!

The message absolutely left us encouraged and hungry for more of what the Lord is going to do this weekend in all our hearts and lives.
