Who Do Others See in Your Mirror?

Pastor Doug added to our weekend verse, 2 Corinthians 3:17 – 18. He focused on the work of the Spirit. One of the dangers in asking others "what do you see in our mirror", is that we see ourselves. We look at our image, but not where we were first invited to look. The face of our mother... her reaction is how we learn. We are reading peoples faces all the time. People read our faces and can see what we are saying without words.

When all you know are the rules and what is expected of us, we are wearing a veil. But when we see the Spirit that veil is removed. When we look at ourselves in a mirror we are looking at our likes and dislikes. What others are thinking of us. Checking and reading faces and body language and what they say about us.

We are looking for change on a VdC weekend, but....we don't know whether the seed has landed among the rocks or if it is going to be fertile ground. But we want to know.

We are all mirrors. What we see when you look at me is your own reflection.

The image that we are to see in others is Jesus.. The tool for this is the Reunion Group.

Asking – Where did you see Jesus this week? When you begin to ask this, you begin to see Jesus. But then you see Him in the harder places – Forgiveness, Fasting, Repentance.... Everywhere. Because there is no where that Jesus is not.

We are totally safe with Jesus. He never...mocks, shames or ignores us. He always celebrates us. He cherishes us and chooses us every time.

We practice this in reunion. Jesus is never surprised. It's not a surprise because it is forgiven. In a fully functional reunion group, we know each other's experiences of Jesus, the challenges each are facing and each member sins and sinfulness. Patterns of sinfulness and the ways we live in opposition to God.

Pastor Doug challenged us to think of these things for yourself and then of one of your reunion group members.

- What is a significant experience of Jesus that you had?
- What is a challenge that you are facing right now?
- What is the sinfulness with which you are most struggling right now?

We should be able to do this unconsciously. This is all about the part of being in reunion. Be authentic, real and vulnerable. Your reunion group should listen to you with the face of Jesus. Make your reunion group be spiritual direction groups that allow us to see the face of Jesus and feel safe. The reunion group should "lift the veil" and show you, Jesus in you.

Some of the things that Pastor Doug encouraged us to do is go on a retreat – There is a spiritual principle here. You cannot be in authority unless you are under authority.
